VIRTUALARCH PROJECT - ROMAN PORT OF BARBIR, SUKOŠAN

The former Roman port of Barbir is a submerged archaeological site at a depth of about 1 - 3.6 meters in the village of Sukošan near Zadar. Visible submerged stone structures were defined as the remains of two piers and / or breakwaters that closed and secured the harbor, and the remains of an ancient ship and numerous small archaeological finds enabled the dating of the port of Barbir from the 3rd to the 5th century. As part of Interreg Central Europe programme and its VirtualArch project, ICUA Zadar conducted scientific research on the site and the site was surveyed and documented to obtain 3D model of the site, which in turn was rendered into a 3D reconstruction video, a mobile application of the same name (Virtual Archaeology – Roman Harbour near Zadar) and an information panel placed on the site, providing information with modern interpretation and protection of this cultural property.
