3RD TRANSNATIONAL MEETING

International Campus of Excellence of the Sea (CEIMAR)



The project partners gathered in Cadiz for a meeting in which they presented in detail the work done to develop and complete the Project Result 1 (innovative course on the enhancement and communication of underwater archaeological heritage) and to show the final result, as well as to define the common structure to be followed in the national on-site trainings, which will be implemented in each country before summer 2023, to test the training course.

The objective of the meeting was to **present the international strategic partnership within the U-Mar project** (valorization of cultural heritage through underwater archaeology), provide useful information and outcomes to local decision makers and exchange views.

ICUA Zadar director **Mladen Pešić** gave the opening word to the meeting, after which **Doris Kurtov**, head of the international cooperation and funding department gave an introduction of the Council of Europe and to the Phonecian's route to the atendees.



Ivan Vidulić gave a presentation of the U-Mar project and presented the summary of the new innovative course on underwater archaeology for cultural operators to the participants of the meeting. This meeting served to present local stakeholders with the work completed during the Project Result 1 phase for which ICUA Zadar was the leading project partner, as well as with future steps of the U-Mar project and how the local community and stakeholders could benefit from the outcome of the project.

Representatives of the Phoenicians' Route - Cultural Route of the Council of Europe - presented the U-Mar project at the 9th International Historic Cities Congress in Solin, organized by the Solin Tourist Board, a member of the Phoenicians' Route. 


U-MAR ROUTES

Underwater archeological route of Ponta de São Lourenço

In Madeira, the underwater archeological route of Ponta de São Lourenço, where the ship **SS Newton**, a British steamer, which sank in the 19th century, in 1881, coming from São Salvador da Baía, loaded with coffee and sugar, will be the target of a chapter in one of the training course units.



This archaeological route was the subject of a complete historical survey, in 2021, within the scope of the Margullar project, financed by the INTERREG Madeira 14-20 Programme, which allowed the inventorying and cataloging of the archaeological assets discovered in this location, with photographic records and video and, consequently, the creation of a tourist itinerary for a new market segment.



Recently this archaeological route was distinguished with an honorable mention in the "Adopt a Shipwreck" award by the Society of Nautical Archeology.
