U.S. Enhancing underwater archaeology

From October 2 to October 13, 2023, the ICUA Zadar conducted an Advanced Underwater Archaeology Course. This course aimed to equip young scientists worldwide with comprehensive theoretical and practical knowledge related to underwater cultural heritage research. Participants hailed from Slovakia, Spain, Greece, and Colombia.

The course included morning lectures by underwater archaeologists and conservators from MCPA Zadar and RGK-DAI. In the first week, underwater surveys and deep dives took place, revealing ancient artifacts in various locations. In the second week, the participants actively engaged in systematic archaeological excavations at the Barbir site in Sukošan, setting up grids, excavating, and documenting their findings, including the ship's structure.

U-Mar project launches training course on underwater archaeology

The closing meeting of the U-Mar project took place in Madeira, ending in January 2024, with the participation of the various partners from Spain, Italy, Croatia and Cyprus.

The first day of this meeting served to take stock of the work carried out and to discuss the possibility of developing other projects, in partnership, in order to continue the work that has been promoted so far. One of the outputs of this project was the design of an e-learning training course, aimed at tourism and cultural operators and other entities, to increase the knowledge of these professionals about the area of underwater archaeology and to raise awareness of the importance of promoting strategies for the conservation and enhancement of our archaeological heritage, as a tourist product.


The general aim of the project U-Mar is to or valorisation of heritage related to underwater specific objectives:



The training course will be available from next October, free of charge, on an electronic platform, through which it will be possible to access the contents of the 7 learning units, which address various topics, namely the importance of heritage protection, documentation techniques, how these archaeological spaces should be managed and protected from other maritime tourism activities.

Another objective of the project will be the creation of a space to promote our underwater archaeological heritage, through videos and other informative material, in order to make it accessible to tourists and the whole community.

Croatian proposal for the protection and management of underwater cultural heritage designated as UNESCO example of best practices in underwater cultural heritage

The 9th Session of the States Parties to the 2001 Convention on Underwater Cultural Heritage, held in Paris from June 13 to 14, 2023, was attended by ICUA Zadar Director Mladen Pešić, PhD. Croatia's proposal, "System of Protection and Management of Underwater Cultural Heritage at Sites Velika Shallows near Cavtat, Letavica, and Baron Gautsch," was designated by UNESCO as a best practice example. This system safeguards underwater archaeological sites, issuing permits for activities near cultural artifacts. "Best Practices" promote public access to underwater heritage and facilitate international cooperation.

Croatia collaborated with ICUA Zadar and the Ministry of Culture and Media, earning recommendation from UNESCO's Scientific and Technical Advisory Body. Italy and Mexico also received recognition for their underwater heritage projects.

This achievement underscores Croatia's commitment to preserving cultural and natural heritage."
