The U-Mar Project Comes to an End

ACHIEVED RESULTS

1. New Training Course on the Enhancement of

Underwater Archaeological Sites

A new Training Course on the enhancement of underwater archaeological sites has been developed to address the needs of cultural and tourist operators, to improve their knowledge in sectors useful to foster the enhancement of these sites and for the development of tourism linked to underwater archaeology.

The idea of creating this innovative course started from the realization that training courses related to this topic focused mainly on the cultural and historical part of the sites, but did not dwell on the aspects more related to the promotion of these heritages and consequently their related tourism promotion and cooperation with other cultural and commercial actors.

The new and innovative UMAR Training course encompasses together all competences and expertise of project partners in order to address the shortcomings of existing training courses, with the aim of creating professional figures who actively contribute to the development of this sector. The course is divided in seven learning units, consists of written and audio/video materials and has been uploaded to the e-learning platform created by partner CEIMAR so that it is accessible. The course is in English for transfer to all European countries, with a brief description and introduction in all project partner languages. The course was tested through On-Site Trainings that also allowed for improvement changes.





2. U-Mar E-learning Platform

The developed E-learning Platform serves not only to access the developed course, but also to find out about underwater heritage training opportunities, to access information about existing sites and their activities. This platform is designed for both cultural workers and the general public, thus contributing to both the goals of training and the development of tourism related to this sector.

3. U-Mar Interpretation Centres

As a final project output, all partners worked together to develop the prototype Interpretation Centre on underwater archaeology, choosing the ideal location in which to set up the center, deciding on a uniform structure, topics to be told, and materials to be used for communication and promotion, in order to create optimal information centers for the promotion and enhancement of underwater heritage. A great deal of dialogue and interaction was carried out with the associated partners who contributed to the success of the activity. Some centers are already operational: Machico, Madeira Island (Portugal); Menfi (Sicily); Pafos (Cyprus), Cadiz (Spain); the one in Zadar (Croatia) will be ready in 2024.

Thanks to the dissemination work of the project carried out by the Phoenicians' Route, in collaboration with the Superintendence of the Sea of the Sicilian Region, two other Interpretation Centers, not included in the project, used the methodology of the U-Mar project. One of these centers is already active in Marsala (Sicily-Italy); the other will be created in 2024 on the Island of Pantelleria (Sicily-Italy).

Other Main Outcomes Achieved

a) laid the groundwork for formalizing a specific training course for those who work or want to work within underwater archaeological sites. In fact, the new training course, once tested and piloted, will be incorporated into the training programs of CEIMAR and ICUA;

b) promoted the accessibility of underwater sites to all types of visitors by enhancing digital tools;

c) laid the foundations for the creation of a network dedicated to the theme of underwater archeology within the Phoenicians' Route - Cultural Route of the Council of Europe, encouraging continuous collaboration in the future.

Virtual reality to learn about underwater heritage

The U-Mar project as a clear example of the work developed by CEIMAR and one of the reasons for the recognition of the Phoenicians' Route, those attending the event learned about the results of the U-Mar research project and its e-learning platform from Eva Mena, head of the CEIMAR Coordination Office and Felipe Cerezo, who together with Ana Niveau de Villedary, Carlota Pérez-Reverte, Raúl González and Natalia López, form the team of expert researchers from the University of Cadiz who are developing the project.





The underwater heritage was the subject of discussion in an interesting round table with the participation of Javier Noriega, archaeologist and President of the Andalusian Maritime-Marine Cluster; Josefa Martí Solano, from the Center for Underwater Archaeology of the Andalusian Government; José Manuel Segura, president of the Andalusian Federation of Underwater Activities and Fernando Nieto, member of the Institute of Ceuta Studies. The debate was moderated by Felipe Cerezo, coordinator of the Master in Nautical and Underwater Archaeology of the University of Cadiz.

Finally, the participants discovered the potential of new technologies and digitalization to transmit knowledge about the cultural heritage that we treasure under the sea, thanks to virtual reality, being able to make an "in situ visit" to the findings found by this team of researchers.
